About this Course

Learn practical management strategies to improve outcomes for patients with neurodegenerative disorders. Improve your fundamental understanding of impairments commonly seen in progressive neurologic conditions including management of muscle tone, kinetic disorders and ataxia. This course aims to improve clinician skills from diagnosis through late-stage disease management. Case studies with videos will be used to develop assessment and treatment plans with strategies to address both motor and non-motor impairments including decreased attention, difficulty multitasking, and behavioral barriers that limit therapists' ability to maintain or improve a patient's functional status.

Objectives

- Identify the mechanism of action and common side effects of medications and medical interventions commonly prescribed for patients with neurodegenerative disorders
- Select evidence-based outcome measures associated with functional impairments in patients with neurodegenerative disorders
- Determine an appropriate long-term management strategy for a patient with a neurodegenerative disorder
- Compare and contrast pharmacologic and medical management strategies for disorders of increased muscle tone
- Select an outcome and affiliated subjective reporting strategy for quantifying disorders of increased muscle tone
- Utilize an evidence-based strategy to manage spasticity in patients with neurodegenerative disorders
- Distinguish motor recalibration and affiliated perceptual deficits commonly seen in conjunction with hypokinesia
- Apply an evidence-based strategy for compensation of tremor
- Identify the impact of ataxic movements on established measures of functional mobility
- Utilize an evidence-based strategy to treat functional impairment due to truncal and appendicular ataxia
